


Design, surveying and planning (Construction route)

Digital production, design and development (Digital route)

From September 2021:

Health (Health and Science route)

Healthcare science (Health and Science route) - last enrolments Sept 2025

Science (Health and Science route)

On-site construction (Construction route) – The Trades

Building services engineering (Construction route)

Digital support and services (Digital route)

Digital business services (Digital route)

From September 2022:

Design, development and control (Engineering and Manufacturing route)

Maintenance, installation and repair (Engineering and Manufacturing route)

Manufacturing and process (Engineering and Manufacturing route)

Legal (Legal, Finance and Accounting route)

Financial (Legal, Finance and Accounting route)

Accountancy (Legal, Finance and Accounting route)

Management and administration (Business and Administration route)

From September 2023+:

The International Baccalaureate Diploma (IB) consists of 6 subjects (3 higher and 3 standard), for the six subjects you have to choose one from each of these six lists:

- Maths list
- English list
- Science list
- Humanities/Social Science list
- Languages list
- Arts/Practical list.

Usually you have the option to choose to ignore the Arts/Practical list and take a subject instead from the Science or Languages list etc. if you want to.

Plus you have to study 3 core elements including:

- Creativity Activity Service (CAS) (take part in events and activities in the local community)
- A 4000 word essay
- The Theory of Knowledge (a new subject to all students)
