## Arrangements for GCSE Results

In these continuing uncertain times I hope you are all keeping safe and well. The following is a reminder about the arrangements for your GCSE results. Please read carefully and take note of what you will need to do.

It is essential you check your school's LGFL account from 9am on the morning of Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> August as we plan to send your result to you via e-mail. I appreciate this is not the usual way to receive results, but this decision was made due to the COVID situation and our responsibility to keep you safe. You will also receive communication with a designated day and time slot for when you will be able to come to the Academy to collect the paper transcript copy of your results. It is essential that you keep to the appointment given and bring a form of ID with you, i.e. your oyster card or your swipe card. Failure to do this may mean that staff will not be able to release the paper transcript of your results. You will need to adhere to social distancing and if you are unwell or displaying any COVID symptoms you must not come to school for your appointment and you should remain at home. We will inform you of alternative arrangements.

Please be aware that if for any reason you haven't yet secured a place at a Post-16 institution, Christ The King Sixth Form College have informed us they will welcome applications from St Paul's Academy students. You can visit their website at <https://www.ctk.ac.uk>

The Academy has set up a designated e-mail address for you to access further information and guidance following the receipt of your results. This will go live on Thursday 20 August at 11am.
